





#### The inflation of everything...

Gas prices have recently reached a high of over \$1.65



per litre. That's the highest level since Statistics Canada started tracking the data back in 1990.

These higher gas prices have a greater impact on Albertans than eastern Canadians because we burn more fuel for heating and transportation in our colder, and vastly more spread out province.

In Trudeau's third carbon tax hike during the pandemic, the tax was increased from nine cents to 11 cents per litre on April 1. Ironically, that was the same day Kenney suspended collecting the provincial fuel tax of 13 cents per litre.

The massive federal carbon tax increase of 25%, brings the total to \$50 per tonne of emissions. This reflects an increase from nine to 11 cents per litre at the pump. By 2030, Trudeau plans to increase his carbon tax to consumers to nearly 40 cents per litre!

Trudeau also plans to impose a second carbon tax through fuel regulations that could add an extra 11 cents to the pump price. These two carbon taxes could cost a family nearly \$40 to fuel up an average minivan.

We all know that once governments get their hands on a new source of revenue, they invariably hold on to it. And the rub of this is, according to intergovernmental climate models, that if Canada were to go to net-zero it would likely only make a difference of about 0.02 degrees Celsius to average world temperatures by 2100. Canada is simply not a big player in this global problem.

Yes, we need to do our share to fight climate change. But there are no viable, affordable options to heat Alberta homes and get to work, particularly in rural areas. And federal rebates simply do not begin to resolve the cost of inflation that this tax causes.

Particularly during this high inflation period, the federal government should rethink this plan. Alberta and the rest of Canada simply don't need, and can't afford, increases to a tax that makes the cost of everything even more expensive.





# Edson Youth Council presents plans for Earth Week

The Youth Council was the delegation at Town Council on Tuesday evening. They presented Council with their plans for Earth Week. The Youth Council is coordinating three initiatives for the community to promote environmentally sound practices and increase awareness.

The first of the three initiatives is tree planting. The Youth Council will be giving away 500 white spruce tree saplings, donated by Weyerhaeuser, between April 17 and 22. The evergreen trees provide shade, shelter for birds, are a carbon sink, and absorb water.

The second initiative is garbage clean up. Along with encouraging residents to Reuse, Reduce, and Recycle the youth are planning to head out into the public parks and space to pick up garbage on Earth Day (April 22). They are asking residents to do the same in their own neighbourhoods and along the trails.

The third initiative is the Green Shopper which is designed to encourage residents to bring and use their reusable shopping bags when shopping at local businesses. Residents will be encouraged to collect signatures on a stamp card. Once the 10 spot card is full it can be entered into a draw for a \$50 gift certificate to a local greenhouse.

Meeting Highlights: Council approved the addition of \$35,000 for the Audio Visual upgrades project. While \$50,000 had already been set aside for the project; initial quotes along with supply chain issues have necessitated the increase. Councillors spoke in favour of the project saying it was overdue and the COVID

pandemic has highlighted the need for up-to-date technology and communication equipment.
Councillor Moore asked if the changes would include electronic voting such as the County Council uses and was told that it was not included with the new equipment but may be possible through the program being used to craft the agendas.

The April 12 Committee of the Whole meeting will begin 1 hour earlier than normal. Council approved the change to 6pm as the agenda includes not only budget but items from strategic planning and West Yellowhead Waste Management Authority to discuss.

# **Council frustrated with Province's approach to Provincial Policing**

Frustrations were evident in the discussion around a consultation session regarding the Alberta Provincial Police Service Transition Study which was attended by several council members and regional partners on March 31. The session was closed to members of the media and public. Additionally, municipal politicians and administrators (the only people invited) were told that the facilitator would not answer questions that were political in nature as they were "beyond the scope of his mandate."

'No substantive engagement'
—'Felt like a lecture' — 'If you're not going to be honest just don't do it' — 'Seems predetermined' — 'Wasn't appropriate' — were the comments and responses heard from Town Council and Administration with regards to the March 31st session.

A letter has been drafted and will be sent to other municipalities in the region for support and expressing concern with the lack of true consultation regarding the possibility of moving to a provincial police force.

The Alberta Provincial Police Service Transition Study is available online and outlines the operational requirements, costs, and process to transition from the RCMP to a provincial force as well as assesses current services and capabilities of the RCMP. The study does not, however, provide a recommendation as to whether a provincial force should be created.

The mandate of the PricewaterhouseCoopers study was to "take a whole-of Alberta approach" to "find operational synergies" that might improve services or provide "economies of scale."

"The Transition Study has identified the need for further detailed study across a number of areas to validate the initial stakeholder engagement undertaken. Furthermore, the mandate of the study did not extend

to direct engagement with communities. This should be explored if the Government of Alberta decides to further pursue the creation of a provincial police service, including but not limited to engagement with Indigenous communities," states the report. However, the community and stakeholder engagement as undertaken on March 31 fell short of the mark according to Edson councillors.

Councillor Baier said despite the slide show presentation containing seven opportunities for questions, the facilitator skipped past five of them. Baier also remarked that the first 20 minutes of the presentation was spent outlining numerous questions the provincial representative would not answer.

Councillor Taylor said he felt like the engagement session was the province "just checking a box" with no real or appropriate discussion permitted.

Mayor Zahara said, "If you're not going to be honest just don't do it." Zahara also expressed frustration that the questions and feedback being asked by the government only allowed for responses that would support the outcome the province desires.

In the letter to Minister Shandro, Edson Town Council requests a meeting with the Minister, MLA Martin Long, and neighbouring municipal stakeholders.

"The whole morning was rushed and only provided further evidence that the Government of Alberta is not interested in what Albertans have to say on this issue," states the letter, "Our municipalities believe that changing our police service in the province is the wrong decision, and the government has not provided clear evidence that the APP will provide a better level of service... The issues around rural crime are due to the revolving door of the justice system, lack of crown prosecutors, and the need for increased supports for mental health and addictions. It is not an issue with our police force."



### What makes the "Big Eddy" house historically significant

(Part 2 from April 4 issue) At their March 22 meeting, Yellowhead County Council voted unanimously to support the designation of the "Big Eddy" house as a Provincial Historic Resource.

But what makes the "Big Eddy" house historically significant?

According to the Statement of Significance provided to County Council, the Big Eddy Farmhouse was named for its proximity to a named whirlpool in the McLeod River and is a one and one-half storey Craftsman Bungalow style home, built between 1916 and 1918.

The Big Eddy Farmhouse is significant as an excellent example of the Craftsman Bungalow style of residential architecture. The use of rustic materials, such as fieldstone and logs, is particularly prominent in this building and of interest given the suggested original purpose of the building as a rural or wilderness retreat. Specific character-defining elements are as follows:

Exterior features including:

- Scale, form and massing: one and one-half storeys with basement, on a rectangular plan
- Medium pitch side gable roof, originally with wood shingles
- Shed-roofed front dormer window
- Open-style eaves with exposed rafter ends
- Fieldstone foundationExternal ground-level
- basement access with fieldstone retaining walls

- Round log main floor superstructure with dovetail notches and square corners

- Wood shingle cladding covering timber-framed walls in gable ends
- Full width open verandah with fieldstone pillars at either end and round log support on either side of the central stairs
- Original fenestration pattern, multi-pane sashes and hardware
- Original doors and screen storm doors
- Plan, wide wood trim around the windows and doors
- Massive fieldstone fireplace protruding externally to support the brick chimney flue

Interior features including:

- Original floor plan layout with various sizes of rooms, hallways and stairwells on the main level
- Fieldstone fireplace with plain wood mantelpiece in living room
- Wood trim including baseboards and window and door frames throughout the main floor
- 6-panel interior doors throughout the house
- Hardwood floors throughout the main floor
- Wood stove in kitchen (converted to gas)
- Wood stairs from main to first floor
- Exposed log joists, beams and posts in basement
- Environment:
- Orientation and placement of the house in relation to the McLeod River
- Mature trees and plantings surrounding the house

Whether the "Big Eddy" house will be designation as a Provincial Historic Resource is still subject to affirmation from the Province of Alberta and the landowner, that physical access to the property, if required, will be developed by the Province and/or the land owner at their expense and to Yellowhead County standards and specifications.

#### Instability in our health care leadership is the last thing Albertans need

(FOM) Friends of Medicare is deeply concerned that Dr. Yiu's removal precedes the acceleration of the government's privatization agenda.

On April 4, Alberta Health Services (AHS) announced the removal of Dr. Verna Yiu from her role as president and CEO. CTV News has since confirmed she was fired. There was a year left in Dr. Yiu's contract, and the board did not calling into question the timing and offer any reason for her removal.

"AHS has responded remarkably in the face of this unprecedented health care crisis. Under Dr. Yiu,

Alberta's temporary ICU capacity more than doubled, even while the government allowed COVID-19 to spread unchecked," said Chris Gallaway, Executive Director of Friends of Medicare. "Dr. Yiu was often the only one who Albertans could count on to answer a question in a direct and straightforward way at a government press conference, reasoning for her early removal."

Since its creation in 2008, Alberta Health Services has been tasked with delivering health care to the 4.37 million people in this province. As per their mandate, AHS is 'subject to the direction of, and the resources provided by, the Minister of Health.' Ultimately, the policies and decisions that guide the delivery of our health care system sit squarely in the hands of the government of the day.

"Using AHS or its leadership as a scapegoat for the government's political failings has long served as a convenient means of deflection. and it's safe to say we are seeing that again now," said Gallaway. "In the face of so many ongoing, unprecedented challenges in our health care, the last thing we need is more instability. The least the government could do is show some accountability and transparency when it comes to the leadership of our vital public health care system."

In 2021, Albertans saw the troubling political appointments of two AHS board members: Hartley R. Harris, CFO for Tyler Shandro's 2019 campaign, and Jack Mintz, an avid proponent of the privatization of our health care.

"AHS is under an interim president and CEO while the Board's process of searching for a replacement is underway," said Gallaway. "We are concerned that this will be used as an opportunity for the appointment of a leader who will more readily support the

acceleration of the government's privatization agenda. We will be watching closely as we await the announcement of AHS' new president and CEO."

In his response to the announcement of Dr. Yiu's removal, Health Minister Jason Copping said: "It's time to move forward with an ambitious agenda to improve and modernize the health system and renewed leadership in Alberta Health Services will support delivering those changes."

"What we're hearing from the Minister is classic privatizer double-speak," said Gallaway. "The UCP government has made it clear that they intend to privatize more of our public health care, but what we urgently need from our leadership is a commitment to protect, strengthen and rebuild our public health care system. Albertans deserve better than further privatization."



#### CropChoices updated for 2022: modeling tool can help when finalizing crop plans

"This is the time of the year to be finalizing 2022 crop plans," says Manglai, production crops economist with Alberta Agriculture, Forestry and Rural Economic Development. "CropChoice\$ is a crop planning and risk management decision-making tool that helps forecast revenues and margins for that crop enterprise by using inputs and then calculating the probabilities of achieving the results."

CropChoice\$ helps users make better management decisions about cropping enterprises because it identifies, measures and manages risk. It also supports users to evaluate various risk management strategies such as changing the crop mix, buying crop insurance and negotiating land rental arrangements.

The latest edition features current crop insurance options, including updated risk coverage levels from Agriculture Financial Services Corporation (AFSC). It also includes projected crop costs covering up to 40 dryland and irrigated crops depending on

Manglai points out the 2022 version cannot be used to analyze the option of purchasing the Spring Price Endorsement (SPE), as effective March 15, 2021 AFSC announced the SPE program had been discontinued.

"CropChoice\$ recognizes that future crop yields and prices cannot be known precisely," Manglai explains. "To reflect this, users enter worst, best and most likely values for yields and prices. Varying yield and price information based on individual expectations

will give a clearer and more accurate forecast than traditional linear budgets."

He adds that the user's inputs for expected prices and yields in CropChoice\$ help forecast potential gross margins and profitability expectations for several crop plans.

"It is a very easy program to set up and use, and the manual itself is an excellent resource for understanding the program. Once it is downloaded, double click on the icon, choose start from the welcome screen and get ready to create and compare crop plans."

These updates support Alberta Agriculture, Forestry and Rural Economic Development's commitment of risk management decision tools for the crop industry.
