

Changes underway to school and playground zones

continued from front

Council also passed Bylaw 2273, which set the new active times for playground zones in Edson. Playground zones are now in effect from 7:30 am to 9:00 pm, 7 days a week, year-round.

New signage is being posted over the next few weeks starting with Phase 1 of three phases totalling 13 zones. Target completion date of the three phases is set for midlate fall.

These changes will update all former school zones to the new playground zones as part of the harmonization project.

While signage is being erected, the focus will be on education on the new hours and new zones, as opposed to enforcement. The goal is to allow everyone time to adjust to the changes with enforcement going into effect as the new school year commences.

Background: At their January 11th meeting, Council gave all three readings to Bylaw 2273, amending the Edson Traffic Bylaw. The amendment harmonizes all school and playground

zones to playground zones only. The CAO has been authorized to designate these zones and a review was conducted to ensure the zones fit the current pedestrian traffic patterns.

These adjustments come after a thorough review of all school and playground zones in 2020/2021. During the review it became evident that many zones were inconsistent and many school zones contained playgrounds that were used more than just during school hours.

It's hoped these changes will provide greater clarity and consistency to drivers and increase safety in potential hazard areas when school is not in session. This could include organized events and general use of playgrounds and sports fields after school hours. Safety is paramount, especially in the winter when the sun sets well before 5:00 pm. 

Is This Just Politics?

Instead of targeting gangs and illegally smuggled firearms, Justin

Trudeau has introduced a firearm buyback program that punishes lawful firearms owners. The fact is, hobbyists, collectors, sport shooters, and hunters are not the ones to blame for the rise in gun crime in Canada – gangs, criminals, and the guns they illegally smuggle from the U.S. are.

The Liberal government claims that the firearm buyback program will cost taxpayers between \$400-\$600 million, (likely a lot more). This so-called program will do nothing to get the countless guns illegally held by gangs and criminals off the streets.

Eighty-five percent of handguns come from the United States. Should not the focus be on enforcement? Where is the program to collect and destroy the guns the Trudeau government is now claiming are too dangerous for licensed, law-abiding Canadians to own?

Will legal firearms owners be compensated?

What this buyback program will do is punish those who follow the law by financially punishing them.

Again, the government should focus on supporting grassroots community organizations that



prevent our youth from joining gangs and invest in CBSA and

police anti-gang and gun units to provide law enforcement with the resources they need to stop illegal firearm smuggling and gun violence at its root.

The federal government currently has a tender notice on their website for a "request for information (RFI)," not even a "request for proposals," on how to design the program. The RFI was posted July 14 and amended on July 29 with a closing date of August 17 for those interested in helping with the BBP or buyback program. More than two years after the Trudeau government announced this program, they still don't have the basic structure, despite having already spent more than \$8.8 million on it.

As no buyback program exists, how does this government even put out this price list? Millions have been spent since May 1, 2020, and still nothing has happened.

The RCMP has said they can't oversee this program in terms of collecting firearms. Canada Post has also reportedly told the government that it can't be the main collection point for hundreds of thousands of firearms, either. What do you say?

New murals to adorn **Edson's downtown**



New murals are being painted on multiple downtown businesses as part of the Town's new 'Resilience Project'. This nearly complete one is on Switzer's Drugs building on Edson's main street.

The Edson downtown core is getting some splashes of colour now and in the near future.

New murals are being painted on multiple downtown businesses as part of the Town's new 'Resilience Project'.

The project was made possible by a grant from Heritage Canada and Commemorate Canada. The grant was created to build a sense a pride in Canada, and support the revival of local economies. After the Town of Edson became aware of the grant, they collaborated with the Culture and Arts Network of Edson (CANOE) on the best way to use those funds.

There are five murals planned, but those are only one part of the whole project. "We put our heads together as a group and decided on five murals," said Town of Edson Community Development Coordinator, Diana Inscho. "We're also going to do a documentary and a commemorative book that features twenty of our local residents who exemplify what resilience means."

Inscho also stated the focus of the Resilience Project is, "Not so much on the detrimental effects of COVID, but more the hope and resilience of the members of our community.'

All businesses in the downtown core were given the opportunity to apply for consideration in the mural project. In the end, five businesses were chosen: Henry Family Vision Care, Timberack Home Hardware, the Edson Legion, the Heart of Edson Art Studio, and Switzer's Drug Store. Each business was chosen for their visibility, improvement factor, and proximity to the downtown core. All the murals will be painted by local artists.

The first of the murals is now up on the walls of Switzer's Drugs on the corner of 50th Street and 3rd Ave. The artist behind this piece is Brie Adkins, from Entwistle. When asked about her choice of subject Adkins said, "I saw these vintage jars in the pharmacy and they're super visually appealing, super pretty. I also wanted to have the idea that hands are passing things down, just because Switzer's has been in business for 110 years -so it's been passed down through the generations."

The subjects of the murals are decided on in collaboration between the business owner and the artist, with final approval from a selection committee. The long term hope is that the murals will boost the downtown economy, while also serving to brighten up the core and, by extension, the town as a whole.




General Admission is \$10.00, Seniors \$5.00 with

Wildwood's Logan Hay Sets New World Record

Logan Hay, the third PRCA season standings, generation bronc rider from Wildwood, Alberta, wrote a new chapter in rodeo's history book when he spurred his way to a world record 95.5 points on the spectacular Calgary Stampede mare, Xplosive Skies to win the Hardgrass Bronc Match in Pollockville, Alberta.

The win was worth \$14,922 and brought the July earnings total for the twenty-five year-old superstar to \$93,000, including long-go and aggregate wins at the Ponoka Stampede and a fifty thousand dollar final Sunday payday at the Calgary Stampede. And while not all of that money counts in both CPRA and

the Bronc Match win provides a significant boost in both sets of standings.

But Hay's first thought after the record-setting ride was for the horse that carried him to that record. "You get to pick your horse for the final four based on high score going in so I got to pick first," he noted. "She was the one every one of the guys in the final would have picked. Zeke (Thurston) was 93 on her to win it last vear and she's the rankest horse I've ever seen."

Xplosive Skies is a twelve year-old mare from the Calgary Stampede's Born to Buck program and is equally

proficient in both saddle bronc and bareback riding as evidenced by her 2021 PRCA Bareback Horse of the Year Award.


"With a horse like her, it's gonna work maybe fifty per cent of the time and the other fifty per cent you're gonna hit the ground and you don't even know what you did wrong," Hay pointed out. "I didn't know from about the second jump on whether I was going to make another jump or not. It was a fist fight the whole way, and I honestly didn't know what it looked like. But she was fast and electric, just a flat-out great bucking horse and I figured we were going to be a bunch. I guess it must've looked pretty good."

The older of the brilliant Hay brothers combination knew he had eclipsed the previous record as soon as he heard the score. "I was there when my brother (Dawson) equaled the record, so, yeah, I knew. I was shocked at first and it still hasn't totally sunk in, but it's cool to be part of history and I'm proud for sure."

As for what the win and the remarkable July successes mean to the Canadian talent, he was very clear. "It's relaxing to know I've probably got both finals (CFR and WNFR) made so it's going to be fun for the rest of the season but my plan doesn't really change. I'm home for one day and then it's back on the road. I might be able to take a week or

so in the fall to do some hunting but other than that, I'll be going hard

right to the end of the year."-Rodeo Canada
