Trans Mountain and Midwest make huge donation to Edson Food Bank

Edson has long been known for having a generous community spirit, with local residents and businesses always doing their

best to lend a helping hand.

In recent years, that generosity and spirit has been growing even more as visiting companies like Trans Mountain (TM) and Midwest Pipelines look to make a difference while living and

working in our community.

Inspector, decided to spearhead a 50/50 fundraiser for the Edson Food Bank (EFB) for the second year in a row, with the help of four other guys. Last year, TM and

Midwest raised \$30,000 for the Blaine Friedel, TM Pipeline organization, and this year Blaine decided to "raise the bar a little higher." Blaine explained that he chose the EFB because of their

types of people in the community, including families and children.

Blaine decided to set a goal of selling 2,500 tickets on the pipeline, split into five sets of 500 tickets. At \$20 per ticket, each set would bring in \$10,000, so five winners would receive \$5,000 each. "That way it would be easier to get \$100 out of everybody, because everyone wants one from each set," he explained.

The tickets sold out, bringing in a total of \$50,000, with \$25,000 going directly to the EFB. Blaine noted that the fundraiser had some guys purchasing over \$1,600 in tickets. "There were some big spenders throughout it all, and it's to a good cause anyways," he said.

While a \$25,000 donation would have been amazing enough, TM and Midwest were not finished. They decided to host two early morning food and toy drives, inviting Mr. and

reach to many different Mrs. Claus to be at the main entrance of the vard, where they accepted food, toys, and money from the 1200+ workers that were on board.

> The drive raised an additional \$2,400 in cash donations, and the EFB also received \$28,000 in cheques from contractors involved in the pipeline project, bringing the total to \$55,400. Edson Mayor Kevin Zahara was invited out to draw the winning ticket numbers of each of the five draws, and Tim Hortons donated supplies like coffee and donuts to the early morning events.

> Jacey Kemp-Cox, EFB President, spoke about the donation and what it means to the organization. "Oh, wow, it has been so incredible. The day after the draw, when we met up at the yard for the presentation of the 50/50, I was so moved by how huge it became again this year," she said. "What started out as a small group of

employees from Trans Mountain Inspection and Midwest Pipelines who had an idea, to do a 50/50 and it would be their way of giving back to the community; quickly snowballed and it's been amazing."

"It's funny, because you only have to meet Blaine once, to see the size of this guy's heart and when I heard from him earlier this Fall, he said he wanted to get a head-start on the planning this time, because he wanted to do another 50/50 draw with proceeds to the Edson Food Bank, but he said this time they wanted to go bigger," Jacey said. "A \$25,000 donation from the draw was such a large amount itself, but it more than doubled with the additional donations collected from the various contractors! We were so blown away."

In addition to the cash, the EFB also received 447 lbs of food and "a trailer FULL" of toys from the two-day early morning food and toy drive.

When asked what the funds would be used for. Jacey replied, "FOOD!" She explained that last year alone, \$130,000 was spent on groceries. "We pride ourselves on supplying a hamper that's nutritious," she said, and this donation will ensure fresh fruits, vegetables, and meat can be offered to their clients. "It also allows us to continue supporting other organizations in our community such as Reflections, the United Church Pantry, S.C.O.P.E., and the Shelter Pods."

As well, the EFB passed on their toy donations to the Kinette Christmas Hampers, and

they also assist with client registration for those who will receive hampers. "They will be putting their annual hampers together very soon, so this boost in the toys supply was very much welcomed," Jacey said.

"I believe it is so important to connect with the other organizations in our community as it just makes sense," she continued. "Many of our clients here at the food bank, also utilize the other services in town and it's important we help each other out, as

much as we can, so that no one is going without. We are so fortunate to be able to do as much as we are, and it's because of the generosity shown like this!"

And the generosity continues along the pipelines, as Blaine also noted that Midwest Engineer Joey Joseph put on two recent skidoo raffles, with the first raffle benefiting Noah's Law and the second benefiting the family of Cordell Maclellan, the victim of a shooting at a local business.

Blaine also spoke about the community of Edson.

"The community's been good with us, providing us places to rent, and just the services like the grocery stores and the gas stations and restaurants and that," he said. "It's been good. It's a win-win for both sides."

Jacey also wanted to pass on a holiday greeting to everyone from the EFB. "[We] would like to wish everyone a Merry Christmas and all the very best for the coming year. May your happiness be large and your worries be small."

HRH's A Christmas Carol live-streamed performance a hit

From December 1-4, Holy Redeemer High School performed their production of A Christmas Carol live via Zoom. Audience members could select one of five shows to purchase a live stream link for, which was only \$15 per household.

Typically, the annual main stage show at HRH is performed at the Red Brick, but because they could not have an inperson audience they chose to perform in the school's Drama Room instead, which came with its pros and cons. "The biggest pro was that we didn't have to work the set and costumes to the theatre," said Drama teacher and Director Peter Taylor. "The biggest challenge was,

well, we didn't have a live audience joining us."

The production was filmed and streamed by talented local videographer Spencer Richard (Srvent).

Taylor noted that the students "performed brilliantly" and that he is sure a live audience will be joining an HRH production in-person soon. Approximately 45 students from grades 7-12 took part in A Christmas Carol.

I watched the Thursday night performance and was incredibly impressed with the tenacity and spirit that each and every student involved showed. Their talent and energy was felt even through my computer screen.

The role of Ebenezer Scrooge was double cast with Jesse Cesario and Ethan Toner. Toner

performed Thursday night and he embodied the crotchety old man character of Scrooge throughout the show. His physical acting and consistent scowl made his character's growth to a better person that much more exciting.

Positive energy was felt every time the characters of Fred Holywell (played by Dylan Watson) and Bob Cratchit (Cody Van Beek) were on the stage. They exuded the positive Christmas spirit, playing the perfect opposites to Scrooge's bad attitude.

Jacob Marley was played by Hayden Roth, and he did an excellent job playing the terrifying ghost. The scene where his face replaces Scrooge's door knocker was very well-timed and actually surprised me, even as someone familiar with the show.

The three Christmas Spirits were really interesting, each very different from the other. The Spirit of Christmas Past featured Cassie Pilon as a silent on-stage presence all dressed in white, while a disembodied voice (by Hayley Pardy) took Scrooge through old memories.

The Spirit of Christmas Present was played by Katie Blue, who seemed to have a lot of fun with the role as she showed Scrooge the things that were happening around him. The Spirit of Christmas Future was a huge, hooded figure that ominously pointed towards what Scrooge could expect to see in the future if he didn't change

his ways. With a production like A Christmas Carol, one of the biggest challenges can be mastering the British accent needed for the show. Each student did a great job, with especially notable accent

performances coming Costume design by Carla from Van Beek's Bob Cratchit, Shaelynn Leslie kept everyone Dozorec as Mrs. Dilber, Delaney Kuilboer as Mrs. Cratchit, Toner's Scrooge, and Young Scrooge played by Nolan Taylor.

With all of the talent of the on-stage actors, a solid backstage crew is needed. Lighting tech April Aclan and Sound Tech Michael Aguirre did a great job under the leadership of Stage Manager Haley Squire, along with their team of Assistant and Apprentice Stage Managers.

The set design, which was constructed by Mike Bachinsky and the Industrial Arts Department and painted by Sandy Fedorak and the Art Department, was really fantastic (to the point that I actually wondered out loud if they used real bricks).

Beneke and Carla-Jo feeling like they were in the right time period, while makeup and hairstyling by Emma Laurin and Pearl Clark helped complete everyone's look.

Throughout the run of shows, an online 50/50 raffle was also going on. Audience members could purchase tickets online for their chance to win 50% of the pot, which reached \$980 (winner took home \$490). Peter Taylor shared with the audience that, of the funds that the Drama Department would get from the 50/50, they would be donating 10% to the Edson Food Bank.

Taylor asked that whoever won consider spending their winnings at local businesses, as HRH productions have been supported by local

businesses since the very beginning. He thanked their many supporters including their major sponsor Weyerhauser.

Taylor also referenced the show's Playbill, which can be found at holyredeemerhigh.ca. The Playbill features a full list of the cast, cast and crew bios, thankyous, and on pages 6 and 7 you can find some of the local businesses that have been continued supporters of HRH productions over the years.

If this show had been in person, I would have happily taken part in a standing ovation. These students are a shining example of overcoming obstacles through this pandemic and staying positive despite disappointing circumstances. Well done, HRH.

Arrest made in fatal shooting in Edson

The Alberta RCMP Major Crimes Unit's investigation into the Nov. 4, 2021, fatal shooting of 44-year-old Cordell MacLellan of Edson, has resulted in an arrest and charges.

Maclellan was a father and former oilfield worker who loved outdoor sports. He was working at Indominus Sports on Main Street in Edson when the shooting took place.

Further investigation into the fatal shooting led Alberta RCMP Major Crimes to attempt the arrest of a 21-year-old male on Dec. 11, 2021, at 4:00 p.m., with the assistance of Edson RCMP.

However, the male fled into a treed area north of Highway 16 and east of Highway 32. The suspect was contained awaiting additional resources from the RCMP Police Dog Service and the Alberta RCMP Emergency Response Team.

As the Alberta RCMP Air Services was unavailable to assist, Edmonton Police Service Air 1 provided assistance. At approximately 6:40 p.m., the male was taken into custody by the Alberta RCMP Emergency Response Team.

Brent Michael Dumas (21) of Yellowhead County, Alta., is charged with:

- · First degree murder
- · Possession of a prohibited firearm
- · Possession of a firearm contrary to order
- · Assault with a weapon

Following a judicial hearing, Dumas was remanded into custody and is scheduled to appear in Edson Provincial Court via CCTV on January 18, 2022.

Operations officer Rick Jané, Alberta RCMP serious crimes south branch, provided an online media availability on December 14, where the question was raised that an emergency alert was not issued to the public following the shooting. Officer Jané stated that, "There was nothing to suggest that there was an active, ongoing threat to the greater public outside of the fatal shooting." He added that public safety is of primary importance. "Had the circumstances been different or had they changed, the Alberta RCMP would have certainly issued an emergency alert."

In relation to the charge of Assault With a Weapon, a second employee, a 32-year-old male from Edson, was assaulted by the suspect during a physical altercation, that occurred after the shooting, while still inside the store.

As this matter is before the courts, no further details can be provided.

NOTE: A charge should not be considered as evidence of guilt. In Canada, all persons are considered innocent until proven guilty in a court of law.
