
This is the third year that the County has hosted the event. It

## **Edson Recycle Depot gets new bailer**

To stay up to date with equipment as technology improves, The Edson and District Recycle Depot recently installed a new bailer.

R e c y c l e D e p o t Manager, Anne Auriat, said, "We are so happy to have our new bailer up and running. Our last one was 10 years old and starting to need repairs. It is an upgrade and able to do the job twice as fast as our old one."

"We had some technology with the older bailer, but this is a big jump forward. In 10 years technology changes a lot,"Auriat said.

Jonah Kuzmic added,


"You can program any OCC cardboard, paper, hard or soft plastic, as well as tin. You can see on the computer the position and where you want to tie. The ram can tell you how far you are and how much farther to a full bail. It can tell you how many bails you have done each day or for the month."

Rather than the bails being only 550kg they are now up to 700kg. This makes it easier for shipping and it opens up markets for the Depot.

The new bailer also has two motors giving it more options during use. "In five hours we were able to do 30 bails which is about 20 metric tons of cardboard. We c a n d o multiple amounts of streams as it's able to have two conveyors if we want to spilt it, so we are really excited about it."

"We were down for three days taking the old one out and putting the new one in. We had a crane come in to help. After being shut down for a few days, we had cardboard backed up. But it didn't take long with the new bailer to get all caught up, which was really nice," said Auriat.

"With the Extended Producer Responsibility (EPR) coming into effect it means there is a provincial program coming for the resident i a l p or t i o n . Municipalities will be funded for processing it. We might end up with glass coming in here from other parts of Alberta, paper or other materials to process. It's under a management authority provincewide,"Auriat said.

## **Kinette Christmas Hamper campaign begins with Toy Run**

The Annual Kinette Toy Run took place in Edson on July 6. The event started and finished at the Edson Lions Hall.

The parade of riders got underway at 11:00 a.m. led by the Edson RCMP, the Edson Fire Department, motorbikers, Edson Mayor Kevin Zahara, the 'Stuff the Bus', and whoever else wanted to take part in the event.

Kinette, Mary-Anne Bittner, said, "We are happy to host another annual Toy Run. I have to admit we are hurting, as it's hard to get volunteers. Many organizations are in the same shape these days. This event is our kick-off to start promoting for our Christmas Hampers. It's Christmas in July where we start reminding people we are collecting toys for our Christmas Hampers or monetary donations."

"We used to do registration fees, but with the economy the way it's been we have to open it up and make it as accessible as possible for everybody. If they are able to donate great, but times are tough. This makes a registration fee not feasible for some and can turn people away. We don't want that. Everything today is completely free."

"We have a free barbecue today compliments from Cenovus. They are providing the food and cooking on their BBQ, which is amazing. The fire department is coming down and leading the parade. The RCMP will be directing the 748 intersection, and we are happy about that," said Bittner. "Edson Early Learning and Childcare Centre donated the bus we can stuff with toys. We have Santa here from the Edson Kingz Biking Club. They come every year to support us, and we promote their event, Bikez 4 Kidz, and will be making a \$1,000 donation to them to help purchase the bikes. They like to come out and help us with our Christmas Hampers too," Bittner said.

"We have a pretty good routine to assembling all the hampers, after years of doing them. Last year we had around 370 families and food hampers were close to 1200. We had between 550 and 600 bags of toys last year, so every child could have a gift. The need definitely grew last year for sure," added Bittner.

"Registration for a hamper is very confidential and non-judgmental. We ensure it stays confidential and the volunteers who deliver have a very solid oath. We take it very seriously," Bittner explained.

The ride started at 11:00 a.m. throughout town. Unfortunately, this year a few places on the route got missed. An apology went to those waiting and not able to see the parade. Not as many riders made it out this year, but it was still a great event.

After the ride, community members were invited to join the free barbecue at the Lions Hall.

This was just the kick off to the Christmas Hamper campaign, so you still have plenty of time to make a donation if you can.

The War Amps have maintained their philosophy of "amputees



workshop, employing amputees and people with

helping amputees" since 1918, when the organization was founded by amputee war veterans returning home from the First World War.

Today, the association continues to serve war amputees, and all Canadian amputees, including children.

Their Key Tag Service debuted in 1946, creating jobs for war amputees in a sheltered workshop and generating funds for the association by providing a valuable service to Canadians. To date, The War Amps has returned more than 1.5 million sets of lost keys to their owners and the Key Tag Service remains a sheltered disabilities. War Amps key tags safeguard keys, including expensive-toreplace car fobs. The service is

free – and it works! As a registered not-for-profit charity, the War Amps do not use professional fundraisers and do not receive government grants. They spend less than 10% on administration and do not tie up funds in long-term investments.

Without funding from The War Amps, it would be very difficult for many amputees to get any prosthetics at all.

Below is a letter we received from the War Amps on summer safety.

#### Letter to the Editor

## **Keep children AWAY from lawn mowers!**

#### Dear Editor,

As we are now in the season of lawn maintenance and outdoor activities, I would like to remind everyone about the potential hazards associated with machinery such as lawn mowers, especially in the presence of children.

I was only two when an accident forever altered the course of my life. Innocently playing outside, I ventured too close to a moving lawn mower, unaware of the danger it posed. The operator was unaware of my presence and backed up, not realizing I had stumbled and fallen behind the lawn mower. I was rushed to the hospital where doctors had to amputate my right arm above the elbow and part of my left hand.

As a graduate of The War Amps Child Amputee (CHAMP) Program, I am advocating for safety measures around lawn mowers. I accept who I am today, but I wouldn't want another child to go through what I did.

It's important to recognize that accidents can occur in the blink of an eye, with lifelong consequences. By sharing my story and raising awareness, I hope to encourage greater caution and vigilance among parents, caregivers and communities alike.



## The Province implemented a fire ban on July 10 for the entire Forest Protection Area

On July 10, **EWF061** (pictured) was burning OUT OF CONTROL and located 18 km northeast of Cynthia, 20 km southwest of Wildwood and 6.5 km east of highway 753. It was estimated to be 73.5 ha in size. There were 24 firefighters, six pieces of heavy equipment and two helicopters working on the fire. Airtankers responded and assisted with fire suppression. Heavy equipment was working to build a containment around the perimeter. **EWF062** is UNDER CONTROL and located 11 km northwest of Peers and 24 km northeast of Edson. Yellowhead County Development Permits are also posted online at www.yhcounty.ca. The public is considered officially notified of approved development permits once posted online, in accordance with the Public Notification Bylaw. The Yellowhead County Land Use Bylaw NO 09.21 provides that any person claiming to be affected by a decision of the Development Authority may appeal to the Subdivision and Development Appeal Board or Alberta's Land and Property Rights Tribunal dependent on jurisdiction of the appeal authority. Appeals under the jurisdiction of Yellowhead County's Subdivision and Development Appeal Board require a written notice of appeal and a payment of \$500.00 payable to Yellowhead County within 21 day of the publishing of the Notice of Decision.



## **Fown of Edson's new Structure Protection Unit**

The Town of Edson has a new piece of equipment in place to help protect the community in the event of a wildfire.

In 2023, the Edson Fire Department had budgeted for a new Structure Protection Unit (SPU), and it has now been delivered and put into service. The unit consists of a number of pumps, sprinklers, hose, and other equipment that can be quickly deployed as a wildfire approaches.

"The new SPU will allow crews to quickly and efficiently set up sprinkler protection around the community to help protect homes in the event of an approaching wildfire. It's an



effective tool that can help reduce the impact of fire and embers and help prevent the loss of homes and other important infrastructure." -Edson Fire Chief Brad Milton Town Council set aside \$250,000 for this project in the 2023 budget, and it was carried over to 2024 based on the manufacture and delivery times. The final cost for the SPU was approximately \$215,000.

"With the wildfire emergencies of 2023, and

the increasing fire behaviour in recent years, this project was a priority for Council as we move to increase Edson's emergency preparedness. Having this equipment on hand will give our fire crews the resources they need to act quickly to protect homes in our community." -Edson Mayor Kevin Zahara.

Edson fire crews will be out testing the new equipment and conducting some practical Wildland Urban Interface training.

## **Dangers of blue-green algae when temperatures rise**

Cyanobacteria (blue-green algae) has been identified in the waters of Isle Lake, according to a notice on July 9. Lake users are advised to avoid all contact with cyanobacterial blooms. If contact occurs, wash with tap water as soon as possible.


Do not swim or wade or allow your pets to, in any areas where cyanobacteria is visible. Do not feed fish from this lake to your pets. Consider limiting human consumption of fish from the lake.

## **Dangers of blue-green algae** in Agriculture

"Blue-green algae is actually cyanobacteria, and can produce toxins that can be dangerous," says Shawn Elgert, agricultural water engineer with the Alberta government. "It can cause organ damage or even death if ingested by livestock or pets."

"If you are trying to determine a cause of poisoning, there are other potential toxins on the farm that can also cause harm to cattle such as water hemlock or batteries. You may need to talk to a veterinarian for assistance in determining the cause."

Elgert says the first and most important step is to identify the type of growth. "Blue-green algae can




look like blue-green scum, pea soup or grass clippings suspended in the water. You should start watching for it when the temperatures rise above 25°C."

If blue-green algae is suspected in a dugout, it is best to be cautious, says Elgert. "You should contact a water specialist to diagnose the growth to determine if it is potentially a toxic growth. You should also remove your livestock from the water source in the interim and prevent them from accessing it. One rule of thumb is that if you can grab it as a solid mass in your hand, it is not bluegreen algae."

If blue-green algae is present, the dugout can be treated using a copper product registered for use in farm dugouts. "Once you treat it, consumption should be restricted for up to a month. The use of copper will break the cells open and release the toxins if present into the water all at once. It is important that cattle do not drink the water during this time so the toxins can degrade. You can follow up with aluminum sulfate and/or hydrated lime treatments afterwards to remove the nutrients from the water to prevent regrowth. Sometimes these coagulant treatments are better than a sole copper treatment."

Elgert says there are also preventative measures that can be taken to try to avoid the problem. "Temperature is an important factor in the growth of blue-green algae, so a deeper dugout with

steeper slopes while avoiding slope deterioration would help make the dugout water cooler."

Nutrients are required for growth of blue-green algae. "We have information on how to reduce nutrients from entering the dugout in our Quality Farm Dugouts manual. Buffer strips, grassed waterways, culvert controls and off-source watering systems are examples of how you can reduce nutrients."

Dugouts should not be built in the waterway, as sediments can bring more nutrients into the dugout and depth can be lost quickly, adds Elgert.

"Aeration of the dugout can also help improve the water quality. A dye packet can also be thrown into the dugout to help prevent photosynthesis from occurring, thereby reducing the growth of bluegreen algae. However, one action alone may not be enough to prevent growth."

Elgert also notes that the wind can push the bluegreen algae into highly concentrated pockets where the risk of harm is higher. "Since blue-green algae can rise or fall in the water column, inspection of the dugout should include peering into the deeper part of the water. Always be safe around the dugout by going along with another person and have a rope with a flotation device attached."
