County moves ahead with fireguard plans

During the Yellowhead County meeting on May 14, council discussed the feasibility of fireguards at major population centers around the

county. "Multiple catastrophic forest fires burned across Yellowhead County in 2023 and overwhelmed fire fighting forces. Over 20 primary residences were destroyed and tens of

thousands of residents evacuated. In some cases, multiple times," stated Albert Bahri, General Manager of Protective Services with the County.

Yellowhead County Administration has begun to explore

protection in the form of fireguards to help make the best use of available resources. The Province of Alberta announced a Fire Guard program in early 2024. Yellowhead County with

County moves ahead with fireguard plans

the assistance of a consultant applied for the fire guard funding.

The County has received notice that their Forest Resource Improvement Association of Alberta (FRIAA) Community Fireguard Program funding request has received conditional approval. FRIAA now requires formalized support from Yellowhead County for the project to move forward.

The grant funding amount is conditionally approved for \$2,449,000. Yellowhead County will have to fund a 10 percent contingency and in-kind work from Protective Services.

There are many rural subdivisions and hamlets in the county. Administration and council would like to explore the feasibility of fireguards at major population centers around the county. Areas of concern are Evansburg, Brule, Cadomin, Jasper gate (Overlander), Peers, Niton, Robb, Marlboro, Wildwood.

A planning phase would be undertaken to prioritize each community including consultation with nearby residents, lease holders, and government agencies such as Forestry and Parks, Parks, Lands, Wildfire, and County municipal planners. The fireguards would be built on Yellowhead County owned or Crown Land, and would not include private properties.

Bahri added, "This will bring with it operational costs going forward. We as a municipality will need to maintain these, possibly through grazing leases. We don't know all the options yet, but we will need to make sure that these are kept to their original capacity so that they work."

Following several questions from councillors, Yellowhead County Council voted to formally support the FRIAA Community Fireguard Program CFP-24-18 - Yellowhead County Fireguard Program 2024 in the amount of \$2,449,000.00

2024 Final Budget

During the meeting, council adopted the 2024

Final Budget. The Interim Budget was accepted on December 19, 2023 and that budget went into effect on January 1, 2024. Since the adoption of the Interim Budget the remaining pieces of information that are required for completion of the 2024 Final Budget have been received. These included the property assessment, the requisitions for school taxes, Senior's Foundation and the designated Industrial property assessment and included final amounts for tenders and price quotes.

The overall assessment increased from \$10.9 billion to \$11.4 billion versus the 2023 budget; this equates to \$2.9 million in additional revenue from taxation. As a result of the overall assessment increase the municipal mill rate for the 2024 is 0%. Residential Assessment will change approximately 1.30% as a result of inflation and growth, while

Non-Residential Assessment has experienced a 5.92% change.

Council for Yellowhead County voted to adopt the 2024 Final Budget in the amount of \$238,735,199 as presented. This option will provide final approval and will allow the 2024 Tax Rate Bylaw to be presented. The final budget can be viewed on the County website at yhcounty.ca.

Town council debates Economic Development Strategy and Action Plan

During Edson Town Council's Committee of the Whole meeting on May 14, council debated the Economic Development Strategy and action plan (EDS). Over the past two years the Town contracted Deloitte Consulting in the creation of its first ever Economic Development Plan. Once approved by Council, the plan will provide a framework for the economic development of the area.

The EDS was created after multiple meetings with stakeholders including Council, local businesses, industry, community, and regional partners. The final strategy presented three different sections focusing on different areas for future growth including: 1-Supporting Local Businesses; 2-Creating a Regional Hub for Health and Recreation; and 3-Focusing on Laying the Groundwork for Investment Readiness.

On April 2, the proposed EDS was presented to Council for consideration. While Council generally supported the EDS, there was much discussion around section 2. This section included many items all focused on developing a strategy to "become a rural wellness hub for the region that supports complimentary wellness and recreation businesses". Some Councillors felt that this section was unnecessary, and hard to apply to Edson.

"Administration has taken this feedback into consideration and are providing Council with the following three recommendations to amend the section," explained Morgan Roberts, Economic Development Officer for the Town of Edson.

"Option 1: Leave the wording as previously presented in the original document; 'Develop a strategy to become a rural wellness hub for the region that supports complementary wellness and recreation businesses'. Administration agrees that the original wording of this section was not clear and failed to adequately build on what was heard

through the engagements and building upon the significant investments which have been made in the new hospital and which are being made in the current YCE project.

"Option 2: Re-word section 2.1.1. to better reflect and capture the opportunities that the Edson Health Care Centre (and surrounding lands) can provide and capture the excitement generated by the new YCE project by amending the wording to 'Leverage the YCE development and new healthcare centre to spur community economic development in Edson'.

"Option 3: Remove section 2.1.1., 'Develop a strategy to become a rural wellness hub for the region that supports complementary wellness and recreation businesses', from the document. This remains a viable option for the consideration of Council which would further focus the goals and objectives of the adopted Strategy."

Administration's recommendation was that the Economic Development Strategy be adopted with the inclusion of proposed Option 2.

Regarding Section 2, Councillor Peter Taylor said, "The recommendation you proposed is certainly better than what was there. But I'm still challenged by the things within it." Taylor went on to explain that he understands the idea of creating the health hub, but is not convinced that is something that could work for Edson. "I'm not sold that this is something that this council can do. We're an oil and gas town. And if we want to see economic development, then we need large economic development through that. And we need complimentary businesses to be attracted to that."

Councillor Krystal Cacka said, "I have struggled with that as well. But I'm also able to reflect on other communities that have introduced other new industries to their community. And this was one of methods that they did it. So I am trying to be open minded towards that." She also explained that if we want Edson to be attractive, then town beautification would be important. She asked

Roberts if beautification was laid out in any part of the EDS.

"I would say that while it may not be addressed at the top level here, quite a few of the topics do speak to that," replied Roberts, "Economic development is an interesting topic, because it's never done alone."

Mayor Kevin Zahara also voiced some of the challenges he had. "We are, already a regional hub for health and wellness. We have a ton of private businesses that provide different levels of service, and some just expanded recently. I think it's good if the municipality focuses on what we have already. So I'm challenged with welcoming more to compete, because we have a limited population base."

Mayor Zahara added, "In order to support existing businesses, in order to grow our population base, we need to be focused on industry. That's our strength. Let's try not to become the next Canmore; that's not who we are. When talking about becoming a hub for wellness and recreation, I really think that belongs with supporting our current local health and wellness amenities and helping promote that."

"I agree with what Mayor Zahara," added Councillor Chaka, "Investing in something we already are; there is value in that."

Councillor Greg Pasychny said, "Let's be honest, health is a socialized product in this country and this is not a private facility. We can't control anything to do with it, and we have zero influence or power on it. Let's be who we are. Let's be focus on industry and the supports to get people and families here to support those industries."

In conclusion, Council directed Administration to go with option 3 and removing section 2 from the EDS. However, they decided to redistribute the positive aspects of section 2 into the other sections.

Administration will bring the EDS back to council for final approval after reworking those aspects.

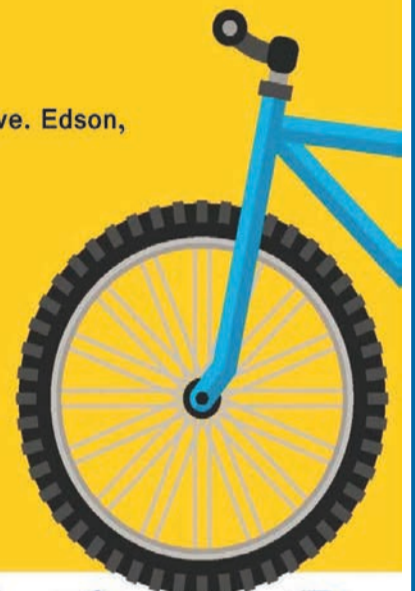

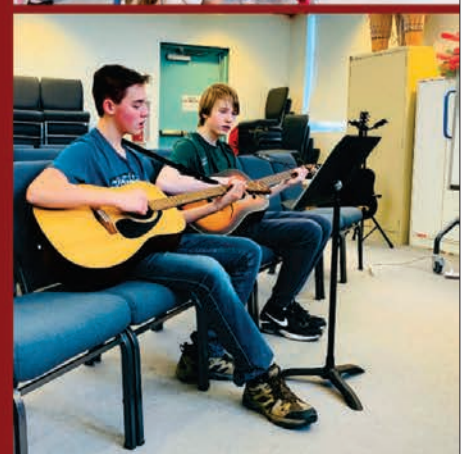

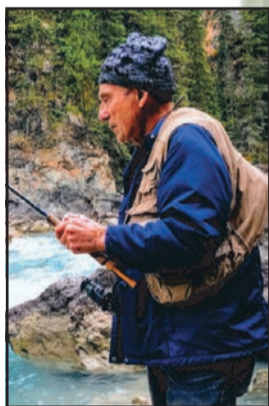

Urban Paul Steffes Jr.

Urban Paul Steffes Jr. was born in Traverse City, Michigan in 1936 to Urban Paul Steffes Sr. and Helen Mileski. The eldest of five children, Paul exhibited an entrepreneurial spirit from a young age, with his first venture being "Paul and Chuck's Bait Shop" selling worms. After high school, he ventured towards the great Alaskan frontier, but only made it as far as Montana when his funds ran dry.



It was there he found work in the forestry industry, where seasoned foresters encouraged him to pursue further education. Paul headed back to Ann Arbor, and earned a forestry degree from the University of Michigan before returning to work for the US Forest Service in Montana. It was on a frosty winter day in Missoula that he met Ann, the love of his life, as she waited for a bus. They married in autumn of 1962.

In 1966, their son Nick was born in Missoula, Montana. Shortly afterward, Paul relocated his family to Grande Prairie to serve in the Alberta Forest Service before settling in Edson, where Paul and Ann lived for the next 55 years. It was here their second son, Patrick, was born in 1969.

Leaving his government position behind, Paul started "Wolf Creek Oil Consultant Services", specializing in right-of-way timber assessment and forest management. However, his true passion lay in the art of the deal, buying and selling anything of value. He sold cross-country ski equipment from his home for many years and was a familiar face at auctions within a 200-mile radius. Paul's collection wasn't just varied; it was a treasure trove of the unexpected, revealing hundreds of items you never knew you needed until you explored his back room.

An avid sustenance hunter and fisherman, Paul cherished the quiet solitude of nature. He and Ann frequently camped in remote locations, typically 25 miles down a logging road, devoid of human presence but rich with secret fishing holes. While Ann enjoyed reading (with a firearm conveniently located nearby in case of emergency), Dad would disappear into the woods with a fishing pole.

Paul's infectious smile and knack for storytelling were his strengths. Frugal yet generous, he was always ready to lend a hand, offering his skills instead of handouts. Paul was predeceased by his beloved wife Ann, his brothers Bill and Chuck, and his first child Sabina. He is survived by his sons, Pat (Joanne) and Nick, and three grandchildren.

The family extends their heartfelt gratitude to the University of Alberta hospital surgery team, ICU, and unit 3E2 staff for their compassionate care during Paul's surgery and recovery. Immense thanks also to Dr. Joanne Robinson and the Edson Hospital staff for their empathy and attentive care in Paul's final days.
