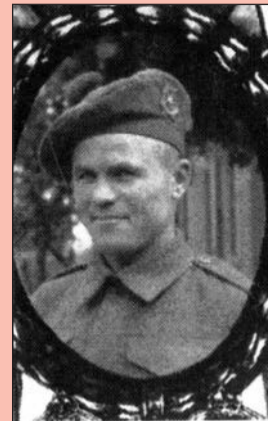

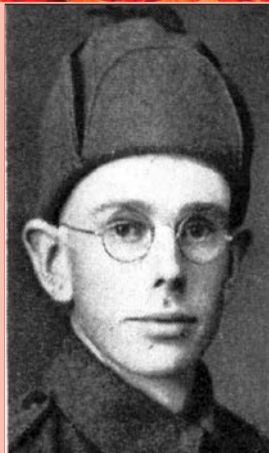

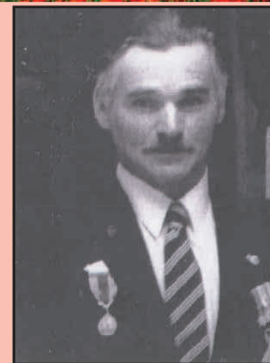

1943 Alan joined the navy in the fall. Took basic training at HMCS Nonsuch in Edmonton, 'stoker' training at Cornwallis, NS and Halifax. He volunteered for RCN Fleet Air Arm (England) 1944-45 training as an aircraft mechanic. Just as squadron was to board HMCS Bonaventure, Canada's only aircraft carrier, peace was declared. Retired from C.I.L polyethylene plant, Edm.



CHARLES FREMONT IRWIN 1895-1977
b. Manitoba;
d. Carrot Creek, AB

1917 enlisted in the army and served with the Canadian Expeditionary Force in Belgium, France and Germany until the end of WWI on Nov. 11, 1918 (as an army medic in the trenches and was gassed). During WWII joined the RCAF. He served at several bases in eastern Canada before being mustered out at the end of the war (Cpl. Irwin CF#2 FIS RCAF). Homesteader of Carrot Creek, AB.
